During this, Dr. Navneet gave detailed information to the participants about the urinary incontinence of women, their sexual problems and the problems of their sexual organs or body coming out, and other types of damage to the body from such diseases.



He said that together we will have to take a pledge that within the next 5 years, Uttarakhand will have to be freed from urinary incontinence free. Significantly, AIIMS's Reconstructive and Gynecology department is the first of its kind in the world to have a SuperSpecialty Department, which has appointed the world's best physicians.
